**COMMUNICATION FROM THE DELEGATION OF ZAMBIA
ON BEHALF OF THE LDC GROUP**

LDC Group Request on Mode 4

The following communication, dated 24 May 2006, from the delegation of Zambia on behalf of the LDC Group, is being circulated to the Members of the Council for Trade in Services.

I. INTRODUCTION

1. This request on Mode 4 is formulated by the least developed country (LDC) Members of the WTO. It implements paragraph 9 of the Modalities for the Special Treatment of Least Developed Countries (LDC Modalities) by identifying categories of natural persons that are of export interest to LDCs. LDCs take note that a number of Members have in their initial offers and revised offers made commitments in mode 4 but some of these commitments do not reflect our interests as they do not to a large extent meet the objectives outlined in Annex C of the Hong Kong Ministerial. This is due to the fact that by far and large they are still linked to commercial presence and to corporate entities in both source and destination countries.

2. In preparing this request LDCs wish their trading partners both developed and developing Members of the WTO to take commitments in Mode 4 in the categories of service suppliers described below in a manner that enhances the commercial value of the request to LDCs and increases their participation in the global trade in services.

3. So far, we continue to see Members taking commitments in an unbalanced nature and continue to a large extent link the provision of services to commercial presence and predominantly in categories of natural persons principally as intra-corporate transferees or independent professionals with high minimum qualifications. In many cases there are very few instances where lower skilled and qualified persons have been scheduled and in almost all cases no relation to competence and demonstrated experience has been made which is important for LDCs given our current high supply capacity in this category of persons.

4. Making such offers is a means for Members to implement their obligations under Article IV and as set out in the Modalities for the Special Treatment of Least Developed Countries.

5. This request is based on the framework for Mode 4 in the Annex on Movement of Natural Persons, which states that "Members may negotiate specific commitments applying to the movement of *all categories of natural persons* supplying services under the Agreement" (emphasis added).

6. The four categories in which LDCs are requesting commitments are the following:

- (a) Independent Professionals,
- (b) Business Visitors,
- (c) Contractual Service Suppliers; and

(d) Others

7. LDCs hope that Members will respond positively to this request. By doing so, Members will contribute to promote the interests of all participants in the negotiations on a mutually advantageous basis. This will secure an overall balance of rights and obligations, as called for by the Guidelines and Procedures for the Negotiations on Trade in Services. The types of natural persons and sectors included in this request are those where LDCs have a comparative advantage and are increasingly continuing to be significant suppliers of these services. This request offers Members an opportunity to show their commitment to reaching a critical mass of high quality of offers, and to giving special priority to providing effective market access in sectors and modes of supply of export interest to LDCs, as provided for in the Modalities for the special treatment of LDCs. The commitment to give special attention for LDC export interests is also set out in the July Framework, and flows from the Doha Work Program, which places the needs and interests of developing countries, including LDCs, at its heart.

8. In addition, commitments in these categories will lead to win-win situations for both, the exporting and the importing countries. More specifically, such commitments correspond to real services supply needs, particularly in developed and developing country markets. Finally, commitments in the last two categories proposed may prove less burdensome to administer than those relating to more highly qualified personnel. In fact, lengthy procedures for the negotiation of agreements on mutual recognition of qualifications may be replaced by more basic verifications of adequate skills, competence and capability to provide the relevant service(s).¹

9. The LDC group reserves the right to modify the content of this request.

II. COLLECTIVE REQUEST IN MODE 4

10. New and/or improved market access conditions are being sought in the following categories de-linked from commercial presence in destination countries and to a greater extent from corporate entities in source countries. We request all our recipient trading partners in the WTO both developed and developing countries to consider these common categories of interest to the Members of this group along with certain common parameters and the market access and national treatment conditions that should be attached to them.

11. For the following categories, Members are requested to make commitments based on the W/120 classification list and taking into consideration common approaches and proposals contained in TN/S/W/14, JOB (03)/195, TN/S/W/32 and TN/S/W/31.

A. INDEPENDENT PROFESSIONALS

Common definition and parameters

12. Natural persons who enter the territory of another WTO Member temporarily in order to perform a service pursuant to a contract (s) between them and any services consumer(s) located in the territory of the other Member having the following the broad characteristics:

- (a) The natural person supplies the service as a self-employed person.
- (b) The natural person has obtained a service contract in the territory of the Member where the service is to be provided.

- (c) Appropriate educational and professional qualifications relevant to the service to be provided.
- (d) The remuneration for the contract is to be paid solely to the natural person.

13. Market access conditions

- (a) Natural persons will be restricted for provision of services at a comparable level of complexity and specialty that require at a minimum either a diploma, or university degree or demonstrated experience.
- (b) Wage parity will not be a pre-condition of entry not precluding fixation of certain minimum ages and/or salary thresholds based on average salaries in the host country.
- (c) List of sectors to which this category will apply will be clearly specified through a positive listing of all sectors or alternatively indicating those sectors where it would not apply. **An indicative list of sectors/ sub-sectors of interest to this group under this category are enclosed in Annex A.**
- (d) Quantitative restrictions should be substantially reduced.
- (e) Economic needs tests should be removed or substantially reduced. In case of the latter they should be applied on an MFN basis. The following further details concerning the ENTs should be mentioned:
 - (i) The services sectors and occupations to which the ENT shall be applied,
 - (ii) The definition, criteria and conditions to be used in applying the ENT,
 - (iii) The timeframe for application of the ENT.
- (f) Natural person can perform services related only to the service activity which is the subject of the contract.
- (g) Duration of stay minimum one year or for the duration of contract (if longer) with the option of renewal.

B. CONTRACTUAL SERVICES SUPPLIERS

Definition and common parameters

14. These are foreign natural persons supplying the service in the territory of the Member concerned on the basis of a contract that provides the primary justification for granting access. These are natural persons either self-employed or employees of a foreign based company/partnership/firm who enter the territory of another WTO Member temporarily pursuant to a contract(s) between themselves or their employers and a service consumer(s) in the territory of the other Member having the following broad characteristics:

- (a) Restricted to self-employed persons or employees of foreign based enterprises with no commercial presence in the territory of another Member.
- (b) The self employed person or employees of foreign based enterprise that has obtained a service contract for a service to be provided in the territory of another WTO Member.

- (c) The natural persons receive their remuneration directly from the consumer (s) or from their employer while abroad.
- (d) The natural persons do not engage in other employment in the territory of the Member where the service is to be provided.
- (e) The natural persons have appropriate educational and other qualifications and demonstrated experience relevant to the service to be provided.
- (f) The natural persons can provide this service contract on a seasonal basis.

15. Market access conditions

- (a) Self-employed person or employees of foreign based enterprises will be restricted to persons with requisite educational qualifications who would be able to supervise, manage or directly undertake the provision of the services at a level of complexity and speciality that require a minimum either of specialized certificates or a diploma a degree, or a university obtained from or demonstrated experience relevant to the service to be provided.
- (b) Wage parity will not be a pre-condition of entry not precluding fixation of certain minimum ages and/or salary thresholds based on average salaries in the host country.
- (c) List of sectors to which this category will apply will be clearly specified through a positive listing of all sectors or alternatively indicating those sectors where it would not apply. **An indicative list of sectors/ sub-sectors of interest to this group under this category are enclosed in Annex B.**
- (d) Quantitative restrictions should be substantially reduced.
- (e) Economic needs tests should be removed or substantially reduced. In case of the latter they should be applied on an MFN basis. The following further details concerning the ENTs should be mentioned:
 - (i) the services sectors and occupations to which the ENT shall be applied,
 - (ii) The definition, criteria and conditions to be used in applying the ENT,
 - (iii) The timeframe for application of the ENT
- (f) Natural person can perform services related only to the service activity which is the subject of the contract.
- (g) Duration of stay minimum one year or six months at a time in the case of service contracts for seasonal employment or for the duration of contract (if longer) with the option of renewal.

C. BUSINESS VISITORS

Definition and common parameters

16. Individual service suppliers or representatives of a foreign based services supplier who enters the territory of another WTO Member temporarily for the marketing of services, to negotiate or conclude agreements for the sale of a service or for the purpose of setting up a commercial presence

of that juridical person in the territory of another Member. This could include either of three sub-categories of (i) Service sellers, (ii) Persons responsible for setting up a commercial presence or (iii) a combination of (i) and (ii) sub-categories into one.

17. Certain common parameters are as follows:

- (a) Individual services suppliers or representatives of such service suppliers will not be engaged in making direct sales to the general public or in supplying services themselves.
- (b) Refers only to individual services suppliers or representatives of a juridical person not already having commercial presence in the territory of the other WTO Member.
- (c) Such individual services suppliers or representatives will not receive any remuneration from a source located within the territory of the other WTO Member.

(i) *Service sellers :*

- (a) Enter to market services or negotiate or conclude agreements on the sale of services.
- (b) Carry out similar activities, including attending business meetings and, holding and presenting at sales fairs, exhibitions and conferences.

(ii) *Persons responsible for setting up a commercial presence*

- (a) Are natural persons responsible for setting up commercial presence of service supplier for which they are a legal representatives, or as representatives of a juridical person.
- (b) The service supplier has no commercial presence in that Member.
- (c) Natural persons who either have been contracted by or are employees of the service supplier.

(iii) *Sales Negotiations/Setting up of Commercial Presence - Merged category*

Those WTO Members that have merged these sub-categories in their schedules would continue to be able to do so. Under the following common parameters:

- (a) Individual services suppliers or representatives of a service supplier seeking entry and temporary stay for the purpose of marketing, negotiating or concluding agreements for the sale of services for that service supplier, and performing similar activities, including attending business meetings and holding and presenting at sales fairs, exhibitions and conferences.
- (b) Individual services suppliers or representatives will not be engaged in making direct sales to the general public or in supplying services themselves.
- (c) Individual services suppliers or persons contracted by or employees of a juridical person, who are responsible for the setting up of a commercial presence of a service supplier of a Member.

18. Market Access Conditions

- (a) Individual service suppliers or persons contracted by or employees of juridical persons will be restricted to persons who have requisite knowledge of the services they are selling or demonstrated experience.
- (b) List of sectors to which this category will apply will be clearly specified through a positive listing of all sectors or alternatively indicating those sectors where it would not apply. **An indicative list of sectors/ sub-sectors of interest to this group are enclosed in Annex C.**
- (c) All WTO Members allow business visitors to enter their country, either under a specific regime, or through general short stay visas for a minimum of six months or for the duration of the period of marketing, negotiating or concluding agreements for the sale of the service or time required to set up commercial presence (if longer) with the option or renewal.

D. OTHER CATEGORIES TO BE INCLUDED IN INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS' SCHEDULES:

- (i) *Installers and Servicers:*

Definition and common parameters

19. Natural persons who enter the territory of another WTO Member territory temporarily to install or service machinery and/or equipment, where such installation and/or servicing is required by a consumer(s) in the territory of the other Member for a service mentioned in the commitment of the host country with the following broad characteristics:

- (a) Restricted to foreign based self-employed persons or employees of foreign based enterprises with no commercial presence in the territory of another Member.
- (b) Foreign based self-employed persons or employees of foreign based enterprise that has obtained a service contract for installation or services of machinery and/or equipment in a service sector mentioned in the commitment of another WTO Member.
- (c) The natural persons receive their remuneration directly from the consumer (s) or from their employer while abroad.
- (d) The natural persons do not engage in other employment in the territory of the Member where the service is to be provided.
- (e) The natural persons have appropriate educational, specialized qualifications and demonstrated experience relevant to the service to be provided.

20. Market Access conditions

- (a) Foreign based self-employed persons or employees of foreign *based enterprises* will be restricted to persons with requisite educational qualifications to provide the service at a level of complexity and speciality that require at a minimum specialised certificates or certificates of proficiency or demonstrated experience relevant to the service to be provided.

- (b) Wage parity will not be a pre-condition of entry not precluding fixation of certain minimum ages and/or salary thresholds based on average salaries in the host country.
 - (c) List of sectors to which this category will apply will be clearly specified through a positive listing of all sectors or alternatively indicating those sectors where it would not apply. **An indicative list of sectors/ sub-sectors of interest to this group is enclosed in Annex D.**
 - (d) Quantitative restrictions should be substantially reduced.
 - (e) Economic needs tests should be removed or substantially reduced. In case of the latter they should be applied on an MFN basis. The following further details concerning the ENTs should be mentioned:
 - (i) The services sectors and occupations to which the ENT shall be applied,
 - (ii) The definition, criteria and conditions to be used in applying the ENT,
 - (iii) The timeframe for application of the ENT.
 - (f) The natural persons can perform services related only to the service activity which is the subject of the contract.
 - (g) Duration of stay for minimum six months or for the duration of the contract (if longer) with the option of renewal.
- (ii) *Foreign based self-employed transport services providers or foreign personnel of carriers/vessels under a foreign flag and foreign registration providing/facilitating internal and international land, air, rail or water transport to a consumer (s) for services mentioned in the commitment of a host country*

Definition and common parameters

21. Natural persons who are self-employed transport services providers or foreign personnel of carriers/vessels under a foreign flag and foreign registration entering the territory of another WTO Member temporarily to provide or facilitate internal , international land, air, rail or water transport to a consumer(s) in a host country in service sectors mentioned in that Member's commitment . They may have the following broad characteristics:

- (a) Foreign based self employed persons or foreign personnel of carriers/vessels under a foreign flag and foreign registration that has obtained a service contract in the territory of another WTO.
- (b) The natural persons receive their remuneration directly from the consumer(s) or their employer while abroad.
- (c) The natural person does not engage in other employment in the territory of the Member where the service is to be provided.
- (d) The natural persons have appropriate educational, specialized qualifications and demonstrated experience , relevant to the service to be provided.

22. Market Access conditions

- (a) Restricted to foreign based self-employed persons or foreign employees of foreign flag and foreign registered vessels/carriers with requisite qualifications, specialized training or demonstrated experience to supervise or undertake the provision services at a level of specialty that require at a minimum specialized training or professional certificates or a degree or demonstrated experience.
- (b) Wage parity will not be a pre-condition of entry not precluding fixation of certain minimum ages and/or salary thresholds based on average salaries in the host country.
- (c) List of transport sectors/ sub-sectors to which this category will apply will be clearly specified through a positive listing of all sectors or alternatively indicating those sectors where it would not apply. **An indicative list of transport sectors/ sub-sectors of interest to this group is enclosed in Annex E.**
- (d) Quantitative restrictions should be substantially reduced.
- (e) Economic needs tests should be removed or substantially reduced. In case of the latter they should be applied on an MFN basis. The following further details concerning the ENTs should be mentioned:
 - (i) The services sectors and occupations to which the ENT shall be applied,
 - (ii) The definition, criteria and conditions to be used in applying the ENT,
 - (iii) The timeframe for application of the ENT.
- (f) Natural person can perform services related only to the service activity which is the subject of the contract.
- (g) Duration of stay for minimum six months or for the duration of the contract (if longer) with the option of renewal.

(iii) *Graduate Trainees:*

Definition and common parameters

23. Non-resident natural persons with a diploma , university degree or post-graduate qualification who enter or remain in another WTO Member territory pursuing post-study work experience for the purposes of obtaining appropriate work experience, business techniques or methods of a service mentioned in the commitment; with the following broad characteristics:

- (a) The natural person has obtained the diploma, degree or post-graduate qualification in another WTO Member or as a non-resident in the host country in which the work experience is to be provided.
- (b) The natural person has obtained a contract for the provision of a service in the host country.
- (c) The remuneration for the contract is paid solely to the natural person.

24. Market access conditions:

- (a) The natural person must be a non-resident with a minimum of diploma or a university degree or post-graduate qualification.
 - (b) Wage parity will not be a pre-condition of entry not precluding fixation of certain minimum ages and/or salary thresholds based on average salaries in the host country.
 - (c) List of sectors to which this category will apply will be clearly specified through a positive listing of all sectors or alternatively indicating those sectors where it would not apply. **An indicative list of sectors/ sub-sectors of interest to this group is enclosed in Annex F.**
 - (d) Quantitative restrictions on this category should be removed.
 - (e) Economic needs tests should be removed or substantially reduced. In case of the latter they should be applied on an MFN basis. The following further details concerning the ENTs should be mentioned:
 - (i) The services sectors and occupations to which the ENT shall be applied,
 - (ii) The definition, criteria and conditions to be used in applying the ENT,
 - (iii) The timeframe for application of the ENT.
 - (f) Natural person can perform work related only to the service activity which is the subject of the contract.
 - (g) Duration of stay for minimum two years or for the duration of contract (if longer) with the provision of renewal.
- (iv) *Personnel of public or private enterprises in another WTO Member with a State contract in the host country*

Definition and common parameters

25. Employees of a foreign based private or state enterprise who enter the territory of another WTO Member temporarily in order to perform a service contract(s) between their employer and a State or government department having the following broad characteristics:

- (a) Restricted to employees of foreign based public or private enterprises with no commercial presence in the territory of another WTO Member.
- (b) The foreign based public or private enterprise has obtained a services contract for the provision of a service in the territory of the other WTO Member.
- (c) The employees of such foreign based enterprises receive their remuneration from their employer.
- (d) The employees have appropriate educational qualifications, training in specialized institutions and competence through demonstrated experience.

26. Market access conditions

- (a) The employees of foreign based enterprises will be restricted to personnel with requisite qualifications, to fill positions for the management of operations or provisions of services that require at a minimum either a certificate or a diploma or demonstrated experience.
- (b) Wage parity will not be a pre-condition of entry not pre-including fixation of certain minimum ages and/or salary thresholds based on average salaries in the host country.
- (c) The State contract could have been obtained at any level of government.
- (d) List of sectors to which this category will apply will be clearly specified through a positive listing of all sectors or alternatively indicating those sectors where it would not apply. **An indicative list of sectors/ sub-sectors of interest to this group is enclosed in Annex G.**
- (e) Quantitative restrictions on this category should be removed
- (f) Economic needs tests should be removed or substantially reduced. In case of the latter they should be applied on an MFN basis. The following further details concerning the ENTs should be mentioned:
 - (i) The services sectors and occupations to which the ENT shall be applied,
 - (ii) The definition, criteria and conditions to be used in applying the ENT,
 - (iii) The timeframe for application of the ENT.
- (g) The removal or substantial reduction of any regional restrictions on the levels of government contracts to which foreign based enterprises can supply service contracts.
- (h) The natural persons can perform work related only to the service activity which is the subject of the contract.
 - (i) The natural persons are contracted or employees of the service supplier.
 - (j) Duration of stay for the duration of contract.

(v) *Personalities of internationally recognized reputation*

Definition and common parameters

27. Natural persons who enter another WTO Member temporarily and are invited by higher educational institutions, scientific research institutes, public educational institutions and non-governmental organizations.

(vi) *Artists, sportsmen or sportswomen or other suppliers of services taking part in public or private performances*

Definition and common parameters

28. Natural persons who enter another WTO Member temporarily and are performing or participating in both competitive or non-competitive arts events, sports events or related training.

(vii) *Fashion Models*

Definition and common parameters

29. Natural persons who enter another WTO Member temporarily and are performing or participating in both competitive or non-competitive public or private fashion events or related training.

Market access conditions others Categories (vi), (vii) and (viii)

30. All WTO Members allow these natural persons to enter their country, either under a specific regime , or through general short stay visas for a minimum of six months with the option of renewal or for the duration of the activities for which they entered or time required to complete their specific activities (if longer) .

III. NATIONAL TREATMENT CONDITIONS FOR ALL THE ABOVE CATEGORIES

31. None other than the requirement for grant of visas/ work permits to service providers under GATS for the various categories mentioned in the schedule of commitments.

IV. TRANSPARENCY ISSUES UNDER MODE 4

32. LDCs would like to reiterate their interest in the transparency of the commitments made under mode 4 in these categories as this can be a useful supplement to the market access conditions mentioned above under each category.

33. Members shall provide information through a single window to applicants in the above categories seeking temporary admission into their country territory that gives a comprehensive description of the complete process for its submission, consideration and approval. The information provided shall include among others:

- (a) categories of permit and their requirements
- (b) documentation required
- (c) method of filing
- (d) processing time and application fees (if any)
- (e) length and validity of stay
- (f) possibility and conditions of extensions
- (g) WTO Members shall publish and make available, including by electronic means, all information pertaining to the temporary movement of the natural persons referred to in the market access column.
- (h) This information will include: visa or permit requirements, length of stay, possibilities for renewal of stay, and any other rules and procedures affecting the entry, stay, and review and appeal procedures related to all of the above mentioned requirements.
- (i) rules regarding accompanying dependants and spouses

- (j) details of relevant contact and enquiry points for further information
- (k) any relevant immigration laws or changes in the laws should also be referenced
- (l) any exceptions to these rules

34. Members shall also provide a full description of the manner in which the scheduled limitations to market access and national treatment for the temporary entry of natural persons in such categories are administered by their authorities through the same single window.

V. ADDITIONAL COMMITMENTS UNDER ARTICLE XVIII

35. Members will endeavor to facilitate mechanisms and accelerate procedures for the verification and recognition of skill, competences and qualifications of LDC service suppliers, including web-based testing facilities and provision of incentives for recruiters to set up such facilities. The testing and verification of skills, competencies and qualifications will be completed without unreasonable delay and in any event no later than **three** months.

36. Members commit to setting up testing facilities to recognise skills and competencies within a period of six months at the end of this round. Where presence in its territory is required to fulfil qualification and licensing requirements of contractual service suppliers and independent service suppliers, Members will grant service suppliers entry to its territory for the period of stay required for the fulfilment of these requirements.
