#### List of Commitments by The Kingdom of eSwatini

The Kingdom of eSwatini herewith submits her final offer of specific commitments in Communication, Financial, Transport and Tourism Services under the SADC Trade in Services negotiations. The list indicates only those services activities in which the Kingdom of Eswatini undertakes commitments.

The Government of the Kingdom of eSwatini requests for an exemption of the Most-Favoured Nation Treatment in accordance with Article 4:5 of the SADC Protocol on Trade in Services for the Financial Services Sector and the Road Transport Services sub-sector. The List of MFN Exemptions is in accordance with eSwatini's List of MFN Exemptions under Article II of the GATS at the World Trade Organization and still applies to the current situation for the Kingdom of eSwatini.
